





#### **REPORT REVEALS 'HUMAN SLAUGHTERHOUSES' AND SERIOUS VIOLATIONS OF MIGRANTS' RIGHTS IN TUNISIA**



Migrants from Tunisia wait to be deported from the Italian island of Lampedusa, as Tunisia has become a major stopover for migrants from sub-Saharan Africa on their way to Europe. A new report, presented to left-wing parties in the European Parliament, paints a bleak picture of the situation of irregular migrants in Tunisia, based on documented testimonies of people who have been subjected to arbitrary arrests, physical and sexual violence.



#### TWO MASS GRAVES OF MIGRANTS FOUND IN LIBYA AFTER BEING SHOT

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) has expressed shock and concern following the discovery of two mass graves in Libya containing the bodies of dozens of migrants, some of whom had been shot. The organization reported finding 19 bodies in the Jakhra area, in addition to at least 30 other bodies in a mass grave in the Kufra desert in the southeast of the country, and it is believed that the total number may reach 70 bodies. The organization indicated that the circumstances of the victims' deaths and their identities are still unknown, explaining that the discovery of the graves came after a security raid during which a rescue operation was completed for hundreds of migrants from the clutches of human traffickers.



# PARLIAMENTARIANS ITALIANS: THE GOVERNMENT MAKE IMMIGRANTS SUSCEPTIBLE AT RISK INSTEAD FROM PROTECT THEM

Rome - Two Italian opposition lawmakers have criticised government policies, saying they are turning migrants into targets rather than protecting them. A press conference is scheduled for Thursday afternoon in one of the chambers of the Chamber of Deputies, hosted by MP Laura Boldrini of the Democratic Party and MP Marco Grimaldi of the Left-Greens Alliance. The conference will be attended by Iranian Kurdish activist Maysoon Majidi, who was acquitted of human trafficking by the Crotone court last week, Iranian activist Parisa Nazari of the Women, Life and Freedom Movement, and Riccardo Nouri, spokesperson for Amnesty International Italy.



### MORE THAN 500 MIGRANTS RESCUED, ONE DEAD IN ONE DAY IN CANARY ISLANDS



Rescue teams have rescued more than 500 migrants off the coast of the Canary Islands, and found the body of a migrant who died after his boat capsized, while the search is still underway for two missing people. The Canary Islands have seen a recent surge in rescue operations, with Spanish maritime rescue teams Salvamento Marítimo carrying out a series of interventions off the coasts of El Hierro, Lanzarote and Gran Canaria throughout Tuesday, rescuing 504 migrants, mostly from North Africa and sub-Saharan Africa.

## STATISTICS ON DEPORTATIONS OF MIGRANTS TO MEXICO SINCE THE START OF TRUMP'S TERM

Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum announced Friday that Mexico has received about 11,000 migrants deported from the United States since Jan. 20, the date U.S. President Donald Trump took office, including about 2,500 non-Mexicans. Sheinbaum said she had reached an agreement with Trump earlier this week to halt tariffs on Mexican goods in exchange for thousands of police officers deployed to the country's northern border to stem the flow of migrants. She also explained that Mexico had in turn returned migrants to Honduras via air and land flights, stressing that the returns were voluntary and not forced. This is done voluntarily, and we provide them with the necessary accompaniment to ensure their safe return to their home countries, she said at a press conference.





# FIVE MIGRANTS TAKEN TO HOSPITAL AFTER TRYING TO CROSS THE ENGLISH CHANNEL TO THE UK

Five migrants were taken to hospital in northern France with hypothermia as they tried to cross the English Channel to the UK, while rescue teams rescued about 30 others on the same boat. The mayor of Le Portel, Olivier Barbarin, described the incident as a near-catastrophe, as 46 people, mostly Syrians, Eritreans and Yemenis, set sail from Le Portel in the early morning. But their plan failed after they lost their way due to the Fort de l'Erre, and returned to shore in difficult conditions. One migrant was trapped 40 metres from the shore and was up to his knees in water, requiring a navy helicopter to rescue him. Five men, aged between 18 and 35, were taken to hospital with severe hypothermia.



# THURINGIA'S HARDSHIP COMMISSION: WHY DO SOME REJECTED ASYLUM SEEKERS GET THE RIGHT TO STAY?

### UK: IRREGULAR MIGRANTS DENIED BRITISH CITIZENSHIP



The British government has announced in its latest measures to combat immigration that immigrants who enter the country illegally will not be eligible for British citizenship, regardless of the length of their stay. Under new guidance from the Labour government, citizenship applications will be refused to migrants and asylum seekers who arrived illegally, including those who crossed the Channel on small boats.

## POPE FRANCIS DESCRIBED TRUMP'S POLICY TOWARDS MIGRANTS AS A SERIOUS CRISIS THAT VIOLATES THEIR DIGNITY

criticised US President Donald Trump's has Francis announcement that he intends to deport large numbers of immigrants, saying the policy constitutes a major crisis that affects their dignity. In a letter to the American bishops, the pope explained that deporting people who fled their countries because of extreme poverty, insecurity, persecution or environmental degradation violates the dignity of many men and women. The Pope called on all believers and people of good will to evaluate the legitimacy of these policies from the perspective of human dignity and fundamental rights. Although he criticized the policy of widespread deportation, the pope acknowledged the right of countries to protect themselves from immigrants who have committed serious crimes, whether in the United States or in their countries of origin.
